Revitalization of the Waterfront With Jean-Marc Léveillé, IT'S SETTLED!

Longueuil, September 30, 2021 — Jean-Marc Léveillé, candidate for Mayor of Longueuil, wants to increase the access to the banks of the St. Lawrence and revitalize the waterfront to make it a place of destination.
