Robert Myles Responds to Concerns from Greenfield Park Citizens

Longueuil, October 20, 2021 — Greenfield Park Borough President Robert Myles and his Borough Council colleagues Peter Doonan and Wade Wilson respond to growing concerns from their citizens about maintaining Greenfield Park's distinct character. They reiterate that with them, the bilingual status will never be questioned. They invite citizens to vote for Longueuil Citizen - Équipe Jean-Marc Léveillé to ensure respect for the rights of Greenfield Park.

“It’s clear that the position of some of our opponents worries a lot of our fellow citizens in Greenfield Park, and it raises questions about their real intentions. I want to assure everyone that as long as we are elected, we will continue to defend the bilingual status of Greenfield Park as we have always done. In our opinion, Jean-Marc Léveillé is the only candidate for Mayor who clearly recognizes the distinct identity of Greenfield Park. An idea shared by francophones, anglophones and allophones of the Borough. Why change a formula which works well, and which makes the richness of our city?” - Robert Myles.
